

National Sandwich Day: A Lesson in History and Creativity

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Factoids & History

National Sandwich Day celebrates one of the world's most popular and versatile meals.

Key Factoids

- **The Date:** National Sandwich Day is observed every year on **November 3rd**.
- **A Birthday Celebration:** November 3rd is the birthday of the sandwich's namesake, **John Montagu, the 4th Earl of Sandwich** (born in 1718).
- **The Name:** While people have been eating food between bread for centuries, the term "sandwich" is attributed to the Earl.
- **Global Appetite:** Americans eat an estimated **300 million sandwiches every day**.
- **Largest Sandwich:** The world's largest sandwich weighed **5,440 pounds!**
- **Anatomy of a Sandwich:** In the United States, a Boston court once ruled that to be legally considered a "sandwich," the food must contain **at least two slices of bread**.

A Bite of History

1. **The Man, The Myth:** John Montagu, the 4th Earl of Sandwich, was reportedly a very dedicated gambler in 18th-century England. Legend says that in **1762**, he was so engrossed in a 24-hour card game that he asked his servants to bring him slices of cold meat between two pieces of bread. This allowed him to eat without a fork and without leaving the table or getting grease on his cards.
 2. **A Name is Born:** His fellow gamblers started asking for "the same as Sandwich," and the convenient meal quickly became known simply as a "sandwich."
 3. **Older Than Its Name:** The concept of using bread to hold food is ancient. For example, Jewish Rabbi **Hillel the Elder** in the 1st century B.C. created a passover custom of putting lamb, nuts, and herbs between two pieces of unleavened bread. The Earl didn't invent the food, but he gave it its enduring name!
 4. **American Icons:** Sandwiches didn't appear in an American cookbook until **1815**. Since then, the U.S. has created many iconic sandwiches, including the Philly Cheesesteak, the Reuben, the Sloppy Joe, and the New Orleans Po' Boy.
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Writing Prompts

Use the following prompts for creative writing, descriptive paragraphs, or persuasive essays.
